

Covenant University Bags Award for the Best Website, Portal System in the Country



T

he recent huge investment by the ICT Sub-Committee of the Board of Regents in Covenant University on the University's website and portal system has started paying off, as the University has won the award for the *Best*

Tertiary Institution website/portal at the 2022 .NG Award organized by the Nigeria Internet Registration Association (NiRA). The award was presented to Covenant after her website and portal system were adjudged the best .edu.ng website/portal in the country.

The metrics taken into consideration in arriving at the best were based on how current the website is, the level of local content on the website, ease of use, relevance of the website for delivery of educational services and how dynamic the website is.

Organizers of the award said the essence of the 2022 awards was to celebrate the achievements and innovation of Nigerian Internet initiatives, showcase Nigerian businesses, individuals, charities, and public and private sector organizations that help to make the Internet a more secure, open, accessible, and rewarding experience for all.

In addition, the goal was to identify how the use of the internet has made learning easy for students and tertiary institutions, taking into account the dynamism that has come into play in the global education system in the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Director, Vice-Chancellor's Office, Professor Omotayo Osibanjo, receiving the award on behalf of the Vice-Chancellor, Professor Abiodun H. Adebayo, said there was a need for more attention to be directed at public schools in the country, especially with the aim of making internet resources free and accessible to them. According to him, "No country records meaningful progress without a commensurate investment in education."

Professor Osibanjo said while many institutions, public and private, shuttered their campuses due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Covenant University was one of the very few whose academic calendar was not disrupted, as the University was able to switch and operate at the cutting-edge of ICT due to the robust investment in internet technology.

"What we enjoy at Covenant University is not available at most public tertiary institutions in the country. As we speak, students in such schools expend more money buying data, which is free in some countries, and our policymakers in the country need to do more in the area of education and internet accessibility, because education is key to any type of development we may be talking about," he added.

While the .NG Awards 2022 voting was open to the general public, a committee made up of representatives of NiRA Accredited Registrars, Executive Board Members, and the NiRA Secretariat acted as the jury, verifying the results and submitting them to NiRA's external auditors.

ACU Chief Executive and Secretary General, Dr Joanna Newman, while welcoming the five new members to the ACU's Council, said the Council represents the diversity and strength of Commonwealth cooperation and its Strategic Plan, 'The Road to 2030', which makes the case for a great part of Higher Education in addressing each of the 17 SDGs.

According to Dr. Newman, "I look forward to working closely with our Council members in our shared

mission to build a better world through higher education."

The new Governing Council and Trustees will run the body for a period of three years, beginning from August 1, 2022. The Association of Commonwealth Universities was establishedin 1913, and has over 500 member institutions in over 50 countries across the Commonwealth and is the world's oldest international network of universities.

This elected body brings university leaders from ACU member universities around the world together, with a shared responsibility to oversee its strategic direction.

Professor Adebayo, representing Constituency III, said the platform to serve on the Governing Council of ACU was just God availing Covenant University another global stage to announce her to the world for the collective good of Africa. Constituency III of the Council comprises universities in East Africa, Southern Africa, and West Africa

Attendees were equipped with the

knowledge to break societal biases as they made lifelong connections with other brilliant minds. The conference featured notable speakers such as Vice President, ECOWAS Commission, Madam Finda Koroma; Associate, Mckinsey Consulting, Mrs. Kemi Onabanjo; and Advisor of Dalberg Consulting, Chimdindu Oduwiegu, who are both graduates of Covenant University.

The 3-day conference attracted students from Anglophone universities across the continent, as they explored and developed solutions to the prevalent problems that African women and the girl child face in the academic environment, in the workplace, and in the contemporary world.

Recounting her experiences, one of the representing students, Adefuye Mofopefoluwa, a 300-level Mass Communication student at Covenant, said the conference was an eye opener, as the platform to interact with knowledgeable female technocrats and entrepreneurs has injected a new level of confidence to proceed as a change agent.

V "It was a life-changing experience for me, and I look forward to impacting other people with the knowledge I have acquired. I got to see great minds from around the continent, and to hear about the great things that young women across the continent are achieving," she added.

Another student representative, Ifi Favour, also said, "Prior to that day, I had always heard about gender disparity and the inequality towards women, but at that conference, I saw the statistics, the figures and I was first shocked. Then, I was motivated to do whatever I could to shorten the bridge and reduce gender inequality."

After extensive discussion and deliberation sessions on the first two days of the conference, the Vice-President of the ECOWAS Commission gave a keynote speech to wrap up the conference. She expressed her heartfelt gratitude to the student representatives for their presence and contributions at the event, while also assuring the University's representatives of a visit to Covenant University.

He said it is the desire of the team to see that the African Centre of Excellence in Covenant becomes a unique Centre that will be very strong and deliver on its purpose and mandate.

Another member of the team, a STEM Expert from NUC and former Vice-Chancellor of the University of Ibadan, Professor Olufemi Adebisi Bamiro, said he was impressed with the strides that Covenant University has taken over the past years, noting it was a thing of joy to see her compete and perform excellently when placed side by side with the nation's first generation universities.

The Assistant Leader of CApIC-ACE, Professor Emmanuel Adetiba, said some of the issues identified by the team are already attended to, with the Centre in the process of


taking custody of HPA worth over N100 million, while an additional 24 servers are already in the works for installation that will make the Federated Genomic (FEDGEN) cloud infrastructure in the centre more of a continental operation that will cut across western, eastern, and southern African regions.

The Centre's Leader, Professor Ezekiel Adebiyi, said CApIC-ACE recognises the need to tweak the procurement process of the Centre so that reagents and other research materials needed to advance the work of the Centre can be quickly and speedily accessible to the students.

Professor Adebiyi welcomed the recommendations of the team and promised that the Centre's leadership would work assiduously and tick through each of the recommendations made, thereby repositioning CAPIC-ACE as a Centre to be admired by the next visiting window.

In his remarks, the Vice-Chancellor, Professor Abiodun H. Adebayo, appreciated the visiting team for the quality of supervision done on the University's Centre of Excellence, noting that it has helped grow the international student profile of the Covenant.

Professor Adebayo said the Board of Regents of the University was passionate about the success of the Centre, which is why it has continued to approve requisite funds in a bid to make the Centre a success story from take-off.

COREN Visits Covenant University,

Calls for full Adoption of OBE for all







team from the Council for the Regulation of Engineering in Nigeria (COREN) on accreditation visit to Departments of Chemical

Engineering and Electrical and Information Engineering, Covenant University, has called for renewed scrutiny of engineering programme curriculum with the goal of repositioning the profession for global relevance.

The Team Lead, Dr Felicia Agubata (FNSE), said accreditation of engineering programmes is a major mandate of the Council, intending to enhance quality assurance and ensure that graduates of engineering programmes in all tertiary institutions in the country are sound, functional and efficient engineering personnel who can meet the challenges of the present and future society, and have the capacity to compete favourably with their counterparts anywhere in the world.

Dr Agubata said the Council's attention had been drawn to the general outcry by employers of labour, to the persistent skills shortage whereby academically sound engineering graduates are unable to express practical functionality on their jobs, thus creating a disconnect between what is taught and that which is expected of engineering graduates on the field. "Outcome-Based Education (OBE) is the missing link that will address these concerns. Thus, COREN adopting the OBE learning methodology for engineering programmes in Nigeria".

She commended the University Management for the robust curriculum used within the University system that has reflected positively in the lifestyle of her graduates and their comportment in the world of work. According to her, "Your products are distinct and unique in their disposition and conduct in the world of work. I have encountered them, and they stand different when compared to their peers. No doubt, you are doing something great and unique here that is in line with your vision of raising a new generation of leaders," he stated

In his remark, the Vice-Chancellor, Professor Abiodun H. Adebayo, represented by the Registrar, Dr Oluwasegun Omidiora, commended COREN for putting together a robust team, cutting across the academia and industry, to undertake a huge national assignment like the accreditation exercise of engineering programme in the University, at such an auspicious time in the nation.

an impressive presentation of her final year project work.







turned out. It was truly enlightening!



The Need for Community amongs Creatives



ne of the smartest things any creative can do is to join a community. The best communities are diverse. They are

multigenerational, multicultural, respect different points of view, and serve as a robust platform for callabarotion and connection. The most affordable resource any creative can acquire will be a pool of people to learn from, teach to, collabarate with, exchange experiences with, and generally grow with. Being with other people is innate to humanity. We need each other! Community brings with it o sense af trust and belanging. In a community, we have the opportunity to draw upon the gifts of others and also to build into others.

Collaborations are one of the most effective strategies for any creative to expand their audience. Imagine this scenario: you're a content creator with 100 followers, and you partner with another content creator who also has 100 followers. You both then decide to create content together, but at first, you don't consider it a good idea because you both have the same number of followers, and you'd more likely prefer to collaborate with someone with more followers. You are gunning for the tap dog. An influencer with over 100k followers sounds more exciting. What you don't know is you stand to gain a lot by collaborating with someone on the same level as you. How? Well, with 100 followers, you both already

have a community that would interact with your content more intimately. You can improve your visibility and double your already existing following. And even more importantly, you get to learn and grow with someone together, but you wouldn't get this with an influencer. They have little to gain from you—and you would certainly part with a few Nairas-all for what really?

Covenant University like every other community has its share of very talented creatives ranging from artists to designers, animators to comedians, and filmmakers to musicians. And how well people show up for each other at Covenant University is a topic that is frequently discussed and contested. Those who do not belong to a community are more likely to conclude that the University does not have an active support system for creatives. One needs only to visit Hebron Startup Lab to find out that this is far from the truth. The comedians at Covenant University are known for their unwavering commitment to showing up and showing out. It's truly incredible how they come through for each other. The lack of competition and willingness to support their fellows whenever one of them hosts a show on or off campus is commendable and is exactly what a community should be

As a creative, you may occasionally come into contact with clients who require services beyond what you can provide. A photographer, for example, might receive a client who needs a videographer, or a graphic designer

might get a job that requires an illustrator. A community provides a network of people that can refer each other for jobs. Many non-creatives wrongly assume that creatives should be able to do the work of others with similar job roles. While it isn't really a creative's job to educate them, many creatives would see this as an opportunity to refer someone they knaw. And they would most likely recommend someone wha is a member of their own community. This 'client-sharing' also happens if some have too much wark on their hands. Referrals are key to running any successful creative business and being a part of a community makes it easier to get more jobs.

As creatives, we desperately need each other. Relying entirely on our own ability will not offer us the right opportunities or increase our capabilities in any way. Find your family today!

NOLLYWOOD AS FORCE BEHIND NIGERIAN CREATIVE ECONOMY

N

ollywood has been and still is a significant employer of labor (possibly the second largest in the nation) for the youth who would not

otherwise have access to quality education. With the continued emergence of reality show spin-offs, young men and women have become knowledgeable in both the technical and practical aspects of the industry. However, Prosper Edesiri, the director of Cake, stated that being a filmmaker in Nigeria is draining. According to the acclaimed director, the Nigerian film industry has gone through observable changes over the years, and there has been a drastic change in the concept, quality, and content of Nigerian films. Yet, he believes that the major problem Nigerian filmmakers face in the contemporary industry is the lack of appropriate expertise and funding to handle the production and distribution of their films.

Although Nollywood accounted for

40% of the Nigerian box office, there are no marketing companies specifically for movies. Over the years, it can be said that the Nigerian film industry has made a great impact on the economy of the country and has the potential to resuscitate the country's economy if the conditions are improved for the filmmakers to produce better work and gain more visibility. In 2018, the arts, entertainment, and leisure industry contributed 0.21 percent of Nigeria's GDP, totaling around N270 billion. In the first quarter of 2019, the industry generated over N87 billion, accounting for 0.27 percent of the country's GDP. The Nigerian box office

also makes a substantial contribution; N4.3 billion was generated in 2017 and is expected to rise to

N6.4 billion by 2022. This is enough evidence to show the extent to which the Nigerian film industry has improved and could still improve with the right expertise targeted at improving the production value and the marketing strategies.

Nollywood has a chance to make a significant difference in Nigeria, but for now, filmmakers around the country still have key issues to deal with in order to reap the full rewards and benefits their international counterparts have profited from.


The Vice-Chancellor took the audience present at the ceremony through the achievements of the university in the past year.














































































Managing your with A Spending Journa

re you unable to determine where your money is going or why you can't save? You can track your spending in detail by keeping a regular


spending journal and spending log. You can discover what you're spending your money on and why by routinely keeping track of your spending patterns and transactions.

A spending diary is a record of each and every purchase you make each day over a certain period of time. For instance, over the course of 30 days. 





As a certified 'foodie', I've had the opportunity of tasting cuisines from all over the world; ranging from Algerian Couscous to Starch and Banga Soup from my home land, Delta State. All of which have been intricately designed to not only satiate hunger, but also give our taste buds an immense amount of joy.


Of all the foods I've tasted, the one I have fallen deeply in love with, is the Ekpang Nkukwo; a dish that ariginates from the Efik and Ibibio people, in the Southern parts of Nigeria. This dish combines two somewhat similar root crops, Coco Yam and Water Yam, as well as other Yam crops of one's choice, to make its base. It is on these food items, that the rest of the meal is made. Other ingredients used in preparing Ekpang Nkukwo include, coco yam leaves, periwinkle, red oil, dried fish, and cow meat; all of which add up to create this highly nutritional meal.

The coco yam leaves, which serve as a wrapping for the grated coco yam and water yam mix, is rich in magnesium, vitamins A, C, E and B6, as well as a good amount of protein. All these nutrients build my

immune system, and meet my needs as a growing woman. The variety of sea foods contained in this dish also provide me with iran, vitamin B12, and zinc, and prevents the anset of diseases. There are many more health benefits I've enjoyed from cansuming Ekpang Nkukwo, which time may not permit me to mention.

My first encounter with the work of art I now call my favourite food, was during a 'Foods and Nutrition' class I was affered in Secondary School. I and my classmates were taught to prepare the dish by the subject teacher. I remember seeing a couple of my classmates scooping spoons of the almost ready meal fram the pot, to eat. It was very funny at first, until it was time for our teacher to share the food amongst us. It was very disappointing to see that the amount of food I was given wasn't up to half af a 'take-away' plate. It then dawned on me that I should have stopped my classmates from stealing the food while I had the chance to. After that day, the only thing I could think about was how delicious the meal was.

I am yet to find something that captures hearts as much as Ekpang Nkukwo has captured mine.





8. Plan your day



"Now the earth was formless and void, and darkness was over the surface of the deep.

And the Spirit of God was hovering over the surface of the waters. And God said let be there and there was light, and God saw that the light was good, and He separated the light from the darkness." Genesis 1:2-4.

The electric light is easily one of the everyday conveniences that affect our lives. It was invented in the traditional sense in 1879 by Thomas Alva Edison, who created the first commercially practical incandescent light. He was neither the first nor the only person trying to invent the incandescent light bulb. In fact, some historians claim there were over 20 inventors of incandescent lamps prior to Edison's version. However, Edison is often credited with the invention because his version was able to outstrip the earlier versions due to three factors: an effective incandescent material, a higher vacuum than others were able to achieve, and a high resistance that made power distribution from a centralized source economically viable. This discovery marked the beginning of commercially manufactured light bulbs, and in 1880, Thomas Edison's company, Edison Electric Light Company began marketing its new product. It is known that Thomas Edison failed nine thousand nine hundred and ninetynine times before he invented the light bulb. If

this is true, what necessity must have driven a man to try and fail this many times?

According to the Premium Times newspapers, The Nigerian government says it will sell electrical power through its generation companies to four West African countries.

The countries are Togo, Burkina Faso, the Republic of Benin, and the Niger Republic.

This is truly baffling. Nigeria, a nation with a low electricity per capita ratio, has ironically been selling electricity to the Benin Republic, Togo, and Niger for years. The reason our leaders give is that Nigerians will benefit from the deal in terms of revenue and job creation.

Ideally, a man who chooses to feed the children of outsiders must first ensure that there are no starving children in his own house. So, if Nigeria supplies electricity to four African countries, why don't we have a steady supply of power in Nigeria? What is the function of the PHCN? How can the countries we sell electricity to have more than we who own it?

According to lightening Africa, A program designed to impact 6 million people.


"Millions of Nigerians do not have access to grid electricity, relying instead on polluting lighting sources such as kerosene lanterns, candles, and torches. The situation in rural areas is particularly acute with only 41.1%

grid access rate. And even among those who have access to the grid, 40% are 'under-electrified' – meaning they have less than 12 hours of grid of electricity per day."

Research has revealed that 1.8 million out of the population of 182 million Nigerians are among the people impacted the most. The electricity access rate, in mral areas, is 41.1 %, the urban area is 86%, and the national level is 59.3%. this statistic shows only one in five people have power from the electricity grid.

A significant hindrance has been the amount of capital (money) needed to produce a constant power supply in the country. More specifically, Nigeria has endured a great deal of trouble securing enough funding to develop any sort of new energy sources or maintain old ones.

One possible solution that the government should be willing to explore is to attract public and private investments into the electricity sector. This is because an electricity reform project would require a lot of money. These funds would then be judiciously used to send meters to everyone's house, to put more wires, more transmission and distribution lines, and more transformers in all the places where it is needed. This ought to be done urgently because, with a quickly growing population, the need to improve the power sector has become even more essential to our survival.

It could be a business that people need and are willing to pay for, and please put your services out there. Just start something. And as you continue, always take calculated risks.

Stream: What should I do if my business does not get enough feedback?


Bolu: There are two things, either you are selling the wrong product, or you have the right product and the wrong crowd. You must ensure that your products appeal to the environment you operate in, that way it becomes easier to receive feedback. Also, be mindful of the fact that not all customers are your customers. It's your job to find who has your money. these people...your customers, would be more likely to give feedback for a product or service they have

Stream: What inspired Vestducation?

Bolu: I started getting questions from a recurrent need, 'where do I put my money?'

Most people do not know the basics of building an investment portfolio. 
1) Osas Ighodaro (The Moon Goddess)



SEDENA WILLIAMS








NOVAK DJOKOVIC:

Unlike many other professional athletes that wake up in the morning and work out before training, Djokovic's morning routine is entirely different; here is how he does his workout

Djokovic usually trains before his workout. This helps him to stretch his entire body thoroughly and helps rid muscle stiffness from sleep, making his movements on the lawn tennis court smoother, swifter, and more seamless. As said earlier, Djokovic, unlike other athletes, begins his workout sessions in






the afternoon, proving that finding what works for you, no matter how unpopular, is crucial to your success.

Novak Djokovic goes to the gym to work on his weight and resistance. This is because, aside from stamina and endurance, he is required to have immense arm and shoulder strength due to his profession. He makes pull-ups, triceps, pulldowns, bench presses, box jumps, side lunges, and barbell squats. Asides from these workouts, getting a massage is also part of his workout routine because he understands that if you don't respect your body when it's tired or ill by allowing it to rest and renew, it won't respect you when it's time to compete. He also engages in foam roller movements such as the lower and upper back roll, hamstrings and quadriceps roll, and calf and shoulder roll. He also spends much time in a workout pod, an egg-shaped pressure chamber that improves blood circulation and helps his muscles recover from the wear and tear he endures all day.





Djokovic's diet includes gluten, dairy, sugarfree, good proteins, and good carbs. Here's how Djokovic eats in a day:

For an afternoon snack, he has an apple with cashew butter.


For dinner, he has salads which consist of kale caesar and tuna niçoise.






