
CU, a world class University in the making - Njoku

Professor Placid Njoku has declared Covenant University a World class institution in the making. Prof.Njoku made this statement while delivering a lecture titled "Quality Imperatives and World Class Standard: Positioning University In Africa for the 21ST Century" at the second convocation week of the University in July. Prof.Njoku identified globalisation as the principal factor that shapes university education. According to

him, the typical

phenomena and characteristics associated with globalisation include global networking global transfer and interflow in technological, economic, social, political, cultural, and learning aspects, international alliance and competitions, international collaboration and exchange, global village, multicultural integration, and use of international standards and benchmarks. He also identified, growing social demand and expansion of higher education system, privatization of higher education, the new public management concept, globalisation and international trade agreement, general agreement and borderless market, information and communications technology as the interrelated factors that

have driven the greater importance attributed to quality assurance in higher education.

Professor Njoku identified ten . attribute of a world class University. Covenant University And REPRONIG agree On copyright

Covenant University has signed a copyright agreement with the Reproduction Right Society of Nigeria (REPRONIG), a collecting society for Nigerian Copyright Commission; thus becoming the first university to do so.

The Vice Chancellor, Prof. Aize Obayan, led the team that signed the agreement. The Registrar, Yemi Nathaniel, the Chairman of REPRONIG, Otunba Yinka Lawal Solarin, and the Executive Director, Dr Inyang Ekanem were also present at the event. The signing of this reproduction agreement is Covenant University's way of respecting Nigeria's copyright laws and showing concern for the rights of intellectual property owners. The agreement is designed to protect such intellectuals and to reward them for their efforts.

By this agreement, the University will be given a licensed to allow its staff and students make photocopies of copyright-protected materials. However, the license attracts an annual fee, which will be distributed to stakeholders of intellectual property through REPRONIG's Member Associations.



The management of Covenant University, has constructed an ultra-modern guest house. The guest house which is built to international standard, is made up of a swimming pool,









This new development will facilitate online registration for courses, access examination results, payment of school fees as well as other activities which would have only been done on Campus.

The initiative has since kicked off operations.

Princeton tops best Universities in America

Princeton holds the top spot in the latest U.S news &World Report college rankings, the year the private, New Jersey school has either tied or held the top slot outright. Just like last year, Princeton was followed by Harvard at No.2 and Yale at No.3 in the controversial rankings. As usual, a few schools moved up or down a slot, but there were no major changes. Stanford was No. 4, followed by Cal Tech and the University of Pennsylvania tied for fifth.

Williams and Amherst were the highest-ranked liberal arts colleges. The rankings, which hit newsstands Monday in the magazine's annual "America's Best Colleges" guide, are facing particularly vocal complaints this year from a group of colleges and educators working to develop an alternative to the system.

So far, the group led by education activist Lloyd Thacker hasn't formally enlisted any of the top-ranked schools. But the magazine has to one complaint: that the rankings punish schools for enrolling low-income students. For this year, U.S. news is factoring the percentage of students receiving Pell Grants into its school's "graduation rate performance." Also this year: the magazine has included the service academies. The U.S Naval A ranked No. 20 in the liberal arts college category, and the U.S Military Academy is No. 22, Force Academy leads the list of "Best Baccalaureate Colleges" in the western region.

The formula for the rankings includes variables such as graduation and retention rates, financial resources, and the percentage of alumni donating money to their alma mater. The single variable- and the most controversial- is a reputation assessment by peer

Harvard University's Endowment Hits \$34.9 Billion

euters reported in August 2007 that the endowment of Harvard University, already America's richest university grew to a new high of \$34.9 billion, boosted by bets on emerging markets, real estate and private equity. Returns for fiscal 2007, which ended June 30, grew 23 percent, significantly above the 16.7 percent gain posted for 2006 and the 19.2 percent gain reported for 2005. The endowment is not a single fund but roughly 11,000 individual funds, many restricted to specific uses like scientific research or the creation of a professorship, the university said.

Harvard, whose investments are closely watched in the asset management industry, also extended its run of beating its internal benchmark and besting the average university's investment returns. The Ivy League school made headlines last month when it lost \$350 million after Sowood Capital, a hedge fund run by a former Harvard employee with whom the university invested, collapsed.


What started with problems in the subprime mortgage market quickly spread and pushed global stock markets lower, hurting many funds, including Sowood. The school said the Sowood loss would have translated into a decline of about 1 percent on a stand-alone basis. But the portfolio actually gained 0.4 percent in July because of its positioning and strong risk management. John

Longbrake, a university spokesman, declined to say how the portfolio was faring in August, as sharp moves in the yen, metals and stocks left some hedge funds with heavy losses and others able to turn July's declines into gains.


Harvard, unlike many universities, still manages a chunk of its endowment in-house at its Harvard Management Company unit. It also relies on outsiders, including HMC alumni, who have launched their own hedge funds, to invest much of the money donated by former students.


Mohamed El-Erian, who replaced Jack Meyer as HMC's president in 2006, is an influential emerging markets bond specialist. And for the second straight year, investments in emerging markets posted the year's highest total return.

Since arriving in Boston, where HMC is located, from California where he worked at Pacific Investment Management Co., El-Erian has rebuilt HMC's depleted staff and implemented other changes. HMC said it restructured the allocations it made to external managers, but gave no details. Looking ahead HMC plans to concentrate on under-exploited market segments to help develop new investment vehicles. El-Erian said Harvard plans to be more transparent about its structure, activities and governance, setting an example in an industry well-known for its secrecy.









This year had more graduates than that of 2006 which was about 700, as 1, 220 passed out with 1212 first degrees, six master's and two doctorate degrees. Accounting had the biggest harvest of all the programmes with 22 in the first class, 194 in the second class and 8 in the third class categories (see table).

Dr. Oyedepo, in his address, said the prevalent situation of poverty, crisis and conflict on the African continent had necessitated the need to raise a new generation of leaders within the context of such core values as spirituality, mentality, capacity building, integrity, responsibility, diligence and sacrifice.





I thank God for giving the Chancellor the vision of Covenant University. I say a big well done to the Management staff and every member of the CU community for driving the vision.











His rise to prominence became noticeable in the year 2000, when he became the executive secretary of the African Center for Policy and Strategic Studies (ACPS) Lagos. Jimoh has outgrown the business of seminars and workshops, which the center was known for. Now, he is making appreciable inroad into the down stream oil and gas, hotel, property, aviation and insurance sectors.

Bolu Alex-Taiwo and Yemi Odejayi explored what exactly makes this mogul. Excerpts

Can we meet you sir?

I was born in Ondo State 40 years ago to the family of Alhaji and Mrs. Yakubu Jimoh. My father was a successful bricklayer and my mum an equally successful fish seller. I am from Okitipupa local government of Ondo State. I obtained my Advanced Level I had my elementary (primary education at St. John's Primary school, Igbotako, and proceeded to Community Grammar School, also in Igbotako. From there I went to Federal School of Arts and Science Ondo, for my Advanced Levels. Thereafter, I went to Obafemi Awolowo University (then, University of Ife) to study Law. I returned a few years later to the same university to bag a master's degree in Public Administration and then proceeded to Harvard for a Master's degree in Law, specializing in Tax (ITP Programme). My hobby is to make money and I also like listening to Christian music.



Apart from being an entrepreneur, what else do you do; any favourite pastime or pet project?

I have a passion for making money and that takes virtually all my time. I take time off sometimes to dance and attend social engagements. I make up time for my family too but enterpreneuring takes virtually all my time.

How did you begin your journey as an entrepreneur and what has been your motivation/ driving force since then?

I started out very early helping my mum and dad in their professions. I helped my mom to sell fish in the market and there is no aspect of bricklaying that I do not know. 
Never-Say-Die The Story of Billionaire Craig McCaw

As is known to investors, McCaw sold the cellular business to AT&T for a whooping \$11.5 billion, only to embark on a more ambitious investment of a global Information and Communication Technology venture.

THIS story of the American billionaire Craig McCaw explains the 'never-say-die' attitude of a typical investor who is confronted by failing economic situations. When good investors' income yields become adequate, they don't just look down, but seek how to improve upon their earnings.

Craig McCaw was born on the 11th of August 1949 in the United States. A renowned communication entrepreneur and savvy investor, Craig was saddled with responsibility at a very young age. While his father was still in control of the company, the senior McCaw was known, throughout

the period of his career, to have bought and sold dozens of radio and television stations; and incurring huge debts in the process. All his four children were involved in the company as employees but Craig overtook the other three; becoming a leader in managing the company.

Craig took over the management of the business as a college student. He subsequently expanded the cable company and steadily switched to the then new and untested field of cellular phone service.

By the end of the 1980s, McCaw's 'Cellular One' had become the best known brand in the telecommunications business; building a national network that successfully put its competitors behind.







If your dressing and appearance would make another person fall


into sin, then check yourself. Why do you have to leave the first three buttons of your shirt undone thereby allowing the young man beside to die in silence?

It is whatever you conceive in your heart, that is portrayed on your outside in this instance, your dressing.







To clean a toilet:

For your information:

The average pH of soft drinks, e.g. cola drink is 3.4. This acidity is strong enough to dissolve teeth and bones! Our human body stops building bones at around the age of 30. After that it shall be dissolving the bones every year through the urine depending on the acidity of the food intake. All the dissolved calcium compounds get accumulated in the arteries, veins, skin, tissue and organs, which affect the functioning of the kidney assisting in formation of kidney stones.



Soft drinks do not have any nutritional value (in terms of vitamins and minerals). They have higher sugar content, higher acidity, and more additives such as preservatives and colorings. Some people like to take cold soft drinks after each meal, guess what's the impact?

The Impact:

Our body has an optimum temperature of 37°C for the functioning of digestive enzymes. The temperature of cold soft drinks is much less than 37°C, sometimes quite close to 0. 


adequately. They help defend against disease as an associated with ageing, like cancer and heart diseases.



Take a Deep Breath and Count to Ten



Ulcer and its treatment



Recent research has shown that there is a similarity between ulcer and breaks that occur in the upper part of the digestive system. It is an open sore in the lining of the stomach that causes pain which affects the normal activities of the victims needed for proper digestion.

Ulcer is caused by helicobacter pylori - a bacterium that lives on the mucous membrane of the digestive system. According to medical research helicobacter pylori causes a good percentage of all the ulcer cases. Ulcer is also caused by the use of nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (a group of drugs used to treat pain and fever). These drugs include Ibuprofen, Aspirin and Acetaminophen.

Extremely long intervals between meal times and stress can also a cause ulcer. Smokers are potential ulcer patients too.

It is well known that ulcer patients have specific diets e.g. meals with enough vitamins A and C content. They are not to take meals with excessive pepper



content. They are also advised to take milk on regular basis to ease the pains.

The following are the symptoms of ulcer; feelings of indigestion, heart burn, unusual weight loss or gain, stomach pain, repeated cases of bleeding in the stomach and passing of black blood and excreta. When these signs are noticed it is advisable to seek urgent medical attention.

Treatment of ulcer can be through the use of prescribed drugs but in severe cases, such as perforation of the intestines, surgeries can be performed to ease pain. Ulcer can be avoided by regular feeding and not smoking.

The Diary of a Fulbright SUSI Scholar

The South Carolina Affair

in the history of Fulbright SUSI.

South Carolina is historically significant to the US for two basic reasons, namely, it was a major entreport through Charleston, where slaves from West Africa were taken during the era of the slave trade. The economy had thrived on slave wealth; hence it was the first state in the south that resisted the Abraham Lincoln-led abolition of the slavery in the US. Thus, the secession of South Carolina-led South from the Union sparked off the civil war in 1861. That is the second reason. The people of South Carolina are warm, religious but conservative. They know how to preserve the history and culture of that part of the USA. Columbia, the capital, where the University of South Carolina is located, is a very welcoming and peaceful city with very friendly people with minimum consciousness of racial differences.



At the State House

That is the right place to start a study of the United States, and indeed, a place to learn the history, culture and people of America.

18 of us arrived the University of South Carolina with much preparedness and expectations. The South Carolina Affair was to take the substantial part of our time in the US. We were to engage in intensive seminars, roundtable brainstorming, research and presentation of papers. The USC affair was intense indeed. We had academic contacts with fifteen Professors from the best nniversities in the country. We barely had time to rest. In the evenings when we were supposed to be resting, we organized seminars for presentation of papers by each of the 18 scholars.

I was the first to make any presentation. I started in a unique way- I sang the national anthem of Nigeria and everyone stood up in honor of my country. I discussed the history, people and culture and religion of Nigeria and how these factors affect Nigeria's foreign

policy; and discussed the leadership role of Nigeria in Africa and US-Nigeria relations in the 21st century.

My patriotism, active participation in class, "use of words and excellent speeches" (as Professor Rosati, Associate Fulbright Director noted) earned me the name "Mr.

President."

My colleagues and students of USC called me that name and still do in correspondences since my return. I am also imitated in my favorite words and phrases, including "however" and "it is pertinent to note', which, plus "put differently" are my acronyms at CU.

While Professor Rosati was fond of reminding me that I am the "future Presidente" of Nigeria; Professor Puchala, the Fulbright Director said I had convinced him that "Nigeria is the future power in the world" and that "very intelligent, thoughtful and gentle people live in Nigeria." Well....

We spent a weekend in Charleston, the historic town earlier mentioned, another weekend in Atlanta, Georgia, where we visited the Cable News Network (CNN), discovering all that makes CNN tick; and were at the Martin Luther King Jr. home, memorial and museum, and visited President Jimmy Carter Center both in

My American

Atlanta. On our way to Atlanta, we went to Fort Jackson, US' busiest military base and symbol of its military power. At Fort Jackson, we were shown the periphery but told of the substance of US power, and were tested in articulacy. military intelligence and sharpshooting. I won the US Army Commanding General's Award for Excellence. I must mention that I wore the CU polo shirt, like I did at many other places of importance, which elicited inquiries about the university. Among the packages from the Vice Chancellor to a number of university officials at South Carolina, are our CU shirts and caps, which Professor Smith, the Director of the host-institute, the Walker Institute, wore several times. Professor Rosati wore the red CU cap twice.

Among other places visited were the Columbiana Cinemas downtown Columbia, where I saw the latest Bruce Willis' movie Live Free or Die Hard and Eva and Almighty. We were also at Wal-Mart, America's biggest all-purpose shopping mart several times where I did most of my shopping. I visited an African-American Church in central Columbia, a Nigerian in countryside Columbia, a Christian family where I had Nigerian food, pounded yam and edi ka ikang for the first time. American food is something else! That was what I ate for about a month- I wasn't able to determine whether it was tasteful or tasteless. However, it felt nice eating American food, which everyone desires to experience!

Washington, Baltimore, New Jersey and New York

After the one-month academic experience at USC, the next stage was study tours to reinforce the academic content of our USC program. We left USC with a heavy heart having become used to that sedate environment. We flew into Washington DC on Saturday July 7, breathing the air of the "world's political capital". That evening, we were at the White House, World War 11 Memorial, Korean War Memorial, Vietnam War Memorial, Washington Monument, Lincoln Memorial where Martin Luther King Jr. had given his famous "I Have A Dream" Speech, among other places.

We had another very busy schedule in Washington DC. We had extensive intellectual encounters at The Pentagon (US Dept. of Defense), National Intelligence Council, National Security Council, US Vice President's office, USAID, Center for a New American Security, George Washington University, the Capitol Hill where we met Congressman Joe Wilson, and the Senate Committee on

Foreign Relations Chairman, and a few other persons. To ease off, I took the subway to China Town to have a change of menu at a Chinese restaurant. Before leaving DC, we were at the Brookings Institute and the Carnegie Institute, two research centers and Think-Tanks. Two former CU students, Jide Durosomo and Chidinma Ukonne, now schooling in Maryland, drove from Baltimore to see me in my Five Star Jury's Hotel at DuPont in DC.

Washington was a mix of hospitality and hostility. Massachusetts Avenue and DuPont were warm because of the concentration of many different races. However, there is a complete discrimination between the rich and the poor- DC has the largest number of homeless people and destitutes I saw in the US-Whites, Blacks, Indians, Latinos, etc. And, they are all over the streets, even close to the White House, there is a destitute, "

Concepcion W. Thomas" he calls himself; he has been there since

1981. He is White House's Chief Critic and right under the nose of the White House Police, he spreads his camp tent to sleep and displays the pics of Bush looking like Osama bin Laden, whom he calls "the Real Terrorist."

We left DC after a most memorable experience, and left for New York enroute Philadelphia, Baltimore and New Jersey. New York is the busiest and probably most beautiful city in America. It is incontrovertibly the busiest city in the world. We were at the famous Broadway Theater, inside the Oprah Winfrey Hall on Broadway where we saw a historically significant dance-drama. We were at Staten Island to see the legendary Statue of Liberty donated by France to the USA at independence, and saw Ground Zero (site of the Twin Tower of the World Trade Center), New Jersey by sea, and other places. I was also at our church at Jamaica Queens, New York where Pastor Mike and his wife are in charge. All my private trips in New York were by metro (subway or underground fast-moving train). I also met the mother of one of my International Relations students, the brother of Dr. Atayero working at the UN. In one of my research outings, I met Nigeria's Minister of Foreign Affairs, Professor Joy Ogwu at the Nigeria Consulate-General in NY, and visited the UN where I was privileged to enter the office of the Secretary-General.

Our group official outings led us to have roundtable discussions and briefings with/from Ambassador Khalilzad, US Ambassador to the UN, Ambassador McNee, Canadian Ambassador to the UN and John Washburn of the UNA-USA. Our meetings were very rewarding indeed.

Los Angeles, Beverly Hills and Santa Monica

The meetings in DC and NY opened our eyes to the actual planning, making and execution of foreign policy. It was practice as it manifests theories. However, we left for Los Angeles, our last port of call, where we were to finalize our studies on the note of encountering American culture and hospitality. This is in the state of California, which has the sixth largest economy in the world. Among

many other places, we were at the LA Harbor, the busiest port in the world; Los Angeles Times, one of US' oldest political newspapers; Warner Bros Studios, world's biggest movie industry; Hollywood and Beverly Hills, the home of the world's famous actors and music artistes-retired and active. Beverly Hills is a rare beauty, but the inhabitants try to create a sort of "class" that insulates them from the rest of the society. Huge fine is imposed on unauthorized visitors, and somewhere downtown, the world headquarters of designer outfits, like Michael Korrs, St. Johns, Dolce and Gabbana, De Beers, Boulche (part of the place where the film Pretty Woman was shot), etc are located. You must have booked online for shopping appointment if you are to come and do shopping at these high-profile places.

Santa Monica is opposite of Beverly Hills in the state of California. It is a balancer of classes, which provides life and fun for both the rich and the poor. We were at the five star Huntley Santa Monica Beach, where David Beckam who had come to debut for LA Galaxy FC had come for an all-night party with fans. We were treated to free chocolates that night, but barred from coming too close to the soccer star by uncourteous bouncers. The Los Angeles trip ended with a farewell banquet for Fulbrights. The exquisite Italian restaurant we had the banquet witnessed outpouring of emotions by scholars who would be departing for home the next day. The US Summer study had come to an end. The stress, like the party, was now over.

Lessons from the Trip

The experience has opened my eyes so much to discover the current trends in my area of scholarship, tools to use for research and teaching efficiency, and increased my knowledge enormously.

By my interactions with the best brains in the US, I have learnt many new things about professionalism in our career.

I made a lot of contacts and collaborations with international scholars. I also established professional relations and established concrete linkages and exchange programs on behalf of my



Sheriff and another Fulbright

University.

The things I saw show that Covenant University is right on course as it has most of what the universities in the US has. What CU needs is sustenance of this enviable culture being developed.

I had the opportunity to acquire books and journals in my field and related areas of scholarship, some of which would be donated to the University; and some to my colleagues.

Studying in the US has afforded me to know that only an infinitesimal and insignificant number of Americans support the Bush policy in Iraq. They describe Bush as the most hated President of the States because of how the "messy occupation"

of Iraq has made Americans unpopular in the world. The US considers Europe and Russia to be geo-strategically irrelevant in the 21st century, but reckons with China and India as potential "friend-rival."

There are many destitutes in the US and thus, those seeking greener pastures in a place where there are indigenes that are homeless, should have a rethink.

In conclusion, my US experience has really helped me discover new perspectives to development in all facets of life and equipped me with new skills that are "pent up" for my discharge at intellectual forums and classrooms. Put differently, my University, my students and my research work will be the greatest beneficiaries of my new status as a Fulbright scholar.

worth importing home and imitating in our personal and national life.

Other things I learnt in my connection with US include contentment: in Nigeria, everyone complains about everything without making a personal commitment to change things. In US no one grumbles or complains, rather they offer to help make it better. There is also a high sense of order: waiting for your turn in an orderly manner by being patient. Nigerians lost the sense of civility since the 80's. Disorder, impatience and rudeness are the fabrics that define our identity. It is almost an abomination to complain, be rude or be impatient in my US experience! And wow! ... the culture of appreciation! You purchase something you get a thank you and appreciation chatters and proper guide from the teller machinist; Nigerians will want to cheat you, abuse you and expect you to thank them for patronising them.

But in spite of these differences in socio-culture, there are some similarities which we share with US. The diversity of their society and culture is similar to Nigeria. However, educationally and intellectually, I believe we are better because we work extra hard due to the unavailability of the supra-structures that they have. And we work extra because of the consciousness of being regarded as 'Third world' or the 'other'. What this connotes is that discrimination or racism 'otherization' is still a part of the US fabric.

Interestingly, their summer is a blend of our rainy season, with it August break and the haziness of harmattan.





The picture of Nigeria is far from that of its titles - the giant of Africa and the sixth largest oil nation.



THE HISTORY OF CONTROL OF CONTROL

asketball is considered by many to be the most popular and money spinning indoor game in human history. It was invented by the Canadian clergyman, educator, and physician James Naismith in December 1891. He sought a vigorous indoor game to keep his students occupied and at proper levels of fitness during the long New England winters. After rejecting other ideas as either too rough or poorly suited to walled-in gymnasiums, he wrote the basic rules and nailed a peach basket onto a 10-foot (3.05Êm) elevated track. He first introduced the game at the Young Men's Christian Association Training School now Springfield College in Springfield, Massachusetts, USA.

The game involved elements of American football, soccer, and hockey, and the first ball used was a soccer ball. Teams had nine players, and the goals were wooden peach baskets affixed to the walls. Between 1897-1898. teams of five became a standard. The game rapidly spread from the United States of America to Canada and other parts of the world. During World War II (1939-1945) the U.S service men popularized the sport as an informal outdoor game. In contrast with modern basketball nets, this peach basket retained its bottom, so balls scored into the basket had to be poked out with a long dowel each time. A soccer ball was used to shoot goals. Whenever a person got the ball in the basket, they would give



their team a point. Whichever team got the most points won the game.

Naismith's handwritten diaries, discovered by his granddaughter in Spring 2006, indicate that he was nervous about the new game he had invented, which incorporated rules from a Canadian children's game called "Duck on a Rock"

, as many had failed before it. Naismith called the new game 'Basket Ball'.

The first official basketball game was played in the YMCA

gymnasium on January 20, 1892 with nine players, on a court just half the size of a present-day National Basketball Association (NBA) court. "Basket ball", the name suggested by one of Naismith's students, was popular from the beginning.


Women's basketball began in 1892 at Smith College when Senda Berenson, a physical education teacher, modified Naismith's rules for women. Basketball was originally played with an association football ball. The first balls made specifically for basketball were brown, and it was only in the late 1950s that Tony Hinkle, searching for a ball that would be more visible to players and spectators alike, introduced the orange ball that is now in common use. The dribble and the bouncing of the ball up and down while moving, was not initially part of the original game except for the "bounce pass" to teammates. Passing the ball was the primary means of ball movement. Dribbling was eventually introduced but limited by the asymmetric shape of early balls. Dribbling only became a major part of the game around the 1950s as manufacturing improved the ball shape. Naismith was instrumental in establishing college basketball. Naismith coached at University of Kansas for six years before handing the reins to renowned coach Phog Allen. In 1892,


University of California and Miss Head's School played the first women's inter-institutional game. By 1895, the game had spread to colleges across the

country, including Wellesley, Vassar and Bryn Mawr. The first intercollegiate women's game was on April 4, 1896. Stanford women played Berkeley, 9-on-9, ending in a 2-1 Stanford victory. In 1901, colleges, including the University of Chicago, Columbia University, Dartmouth College, University of Minnesota, the U.S. Naval Academy, the University of Utah and Yale University began sponsoring men's games. By 1910, frequent injuries on the men's courts prompted President Roosevelt to suggest that college basketball form a governing body. And the Intercollegiate Athletic Association (IAA) was created. In the 1920s there was a rapid

increase in the number of male professional teams. There were hundreds of men's professional basketball teams in towns and cities all over the United States and little organization of the professional game. In 1905, the National Women's Basketball Committee's Executive Committee on Basket Ball Rules was created by the American Physical Education Association. These rules called for six to nine players per team and 11 officials. The International Women's Sports Federation in 1924 included a women's basketball competition. 37 women's high school varsity basketball or state tournaments were held by 1925. And in 1926,







the Amateur Athletic Union backed the first national women's basketball championship, complete with men's rules. The first women's All-America team was chosen in 1929. By 1938, the women's national championship changed

from a three-court game to twocourt game with six players per team. The first men's national championship tournament, the National Association of Intercollegiate Basketball tournament, which still exists as the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) tournament, was organized in 1937. The first national championship for NCAA teams, the National Invitation Tournament (NIT) in New York, was organized in 1938; the NCAA national tournament would begin one year later. During the first decades of the 20th century, basketball quickly became the ideal interscholastic sport due to its modest equipment and personnel requirements. In the 200304 seasons, 1,002,797 boys and girls represented their schools in interscholastic basketball

competition, according to the National Federation of State High School Associations. The states of Illinois, Indiana and Kentucky are particularly well known for their residents' devotion to high school basketball, commonly called Hoosier Hysteria in Indiana; the critically acclaimed film Hoosiers shows high school basketball's depth of meaning to these rural communities. In 1946, the Basketball Association of America (BAA) was formed, organizing the top professional teams and leading to greater popularity of the professional game. The first game was played in Toronto, Canada between the Toronto Huskies and New York Knickerbockers on November 1. 1946. Three seasons later, in 1949, the BAA became the National Basketball Association (NBA). An upstart organization, the American Basketball Association, emerged in 1967




briefly threatened the NBA's dominance until the rival leagues merged in 1976. Today the NBA is the top professional basketball league in the world in terms of popularity, salaries, talent, and level of competition. The NBA-backed Women's National Basketball Association (WNBA) began 1997.

The International Basketball Federation was formed in 1932 by eight founding nations: Argentina, Czechoslovakia, Greece, Italy, Latvia, Portugal, Romania and Switzerland. At this time, the organization only oversaw amateur players. Its acronym, in French, was thus FIBA; the "A" standing for amateur.

Basketball was first included in the Olympic Games in 1936,

Although a demonstration tournament was held in 1904. This competition has usually been dominated by the United States, whose team has won all but three titles, the first loss in a controversial final game in Munich in 1972 against the Soviet Union. In 1950 the first FIBA World Championship for men was held in Argentina. Three years later, the first FIBA World Championship for Women was held in Chile. Women's basketball was added to the Olympics in 1976, with teams such as Brazil and Australia rivaling the American squads. The global popularity of the sport is reflected in the nationalities represented in the NBA. Players from all over the globe can be found in NBA teams. Steve Nash, who won the 2005 and 2006 NBA MVP award, is Canadian; Kobe Bryant is an American who

spent much of his childhood in Italy: Dallas Mavericks superstar and 2007 NBA MVP Dirk Nowitzki is German; All-Star Pau Gasol of the Memphis Grizzlies is from Spain; 2005 NBA Draft top overall pick Andrew Bogut of the Milwaukee Bucks is Australian; 2006 NBA Draft top overall pick Andrea Bargnani of the Toronto Raptors is from Italy; Houston Rockets Center Yao Ming is from China; Cleveland Cavaliers big man Zvdrunas Ilgauskas is Lithuanian; and the San Antonio Spurs feature Tim Duncan of the U.S. Virgin Islands, Manu Ginobili of Argentina and Tony Parker of France. irth.) The all-tournament teams at the two most recent FIBA World Championships, held in 2002 in Indianapolis and 2006 in Japan, demonstrate the globalization of the game equally dramatically. Only one member of either team was American, namely Carmelo Anthony in 2006.



ollowing the last general elections of Federation International of Football Association (FIFA) held on Thursday 31 May, 2007, Joseph Blatter emerged as the President of FIFA for the third time. A curious mind would wonder that what about Blatter that has made him retain this exhorted position for so long. Come with as we explore the life of the man of the moment in the round lather game. Joseph was born in Switzerland, Swiss town of Visp on the 10th of March

1936. He graduated from the Sion and St. Maurice colleges in Switzerland with a schoolleaving certificate and then gained a degree as Bachelor of Business Administration and Economics from the Faculty of Law at Lausanne University. Joseph S. Blatter is one of the most versatile and experienced exponents of international sports diplomacy and is totally committed to serving football, FIFA and the youth of the world. The International Olympic Committee acknowledged Mr Blatter's achievements by electing him as a new committee member. He is also a language guru; speaking four international Languages-French, English, Spanish, Italian.

For nine years now he has retained the executive position as FIFA'S President. Blatter began his professional career as Head of Public Relations of the Valaisan Tourist Board in his native Switzerland and then became General Secretary of the Swiss Ice Hockey Federation (1964). He then pursued journalistic and public relations activities in

the fields of sport and private industry. As Director of Sports Timing and Public Relations of Longines S.A., he was involved in the organisation of the 1972 and 1976 Olympic Games, acquiring his first taste of the international sports scene.



FIFA President, Joseph Blatter

As part of his achievements in the summer of 1975, as Director of Technical Development Programmes at FIFA, Mr. Blatter began to set President Joã o Havelange's projects into motion. It was the time when ideas for competition and educational programmes were germinating and the foundations being laid for competitions in the under-20 and under-17 categories as well as women's and indoor football, all of which are pillars of FIFA's worldwide activity. In 1981 the Executive Committee of the world governing body designated the multilingual Blatter as the new General Secretary and in 1990 promoted him to Chief

Executive Officer (CEO). A total of five World Cups were staged under his auspices (Spain in 1982, Mexico in 1986, Italy in 1990, USA in 1994 and France in 1998). Since he was elected FIFA President in June 1998, Joseph S.
